MEDIAEVAL MONEY

Apart from the Roman period, the Collection contains mediaeval coins, of which there is a significant hoard of Aquileian denarii from the 15th century that circulated in the regions of the Croatian coast and Dalmatia. The hoard was discovered during the construction of a hospital in 1933.

It contained the denarii of Antonius II. Panciera, patriarch (1402 - 1411), with depictions of a helmet or halved coat of arms with stars and arms on the obverse and the eagle of Aquileia in a circle of beads on the reverse. The hoard also includes the denarii of Ludovico II di Teck (1412 - 1437) with depictions of the coat of arms of the patriarch on a shield with an oblique chessboard on the obverse and the Virgin Mary with a halo sitting on the reverse.


